







WHAT IS SACRED SEASON?

At Near Church, we begin each new year by setting aside time to pray and fast together. In doing this, we are consecrating - or devoting - the year to God.

This is a time of spiritual growth for our church community as we pursue God corporately, but it is also a tremendous opportunity to rekindle the flame of your own relationship with God as well. It's our prayer that this season will breathe fresh wind into your life and draw you closer to God than ever before.

This year, our official corporate fast will last from 1/6 - 1/26.



HOW TO PREPARE

Begin preparations for your fast by praying. Ask God for wisdom regarding which type of fast you should do. Maybe your fast should include taking time away from social media or limiting screen time in favor of reading your Bible. Whatever it is, your fast is between you and God, so take the time to seek Him. If you have any specific needs or prayer points you'd like to remember, write them down. This is a time to focus on the areas of your life that God is speaking to you about.

Fasting not only affects your physical body, but it also impacts your mental health. You'll find your mood and outlook will improve as you spend more time in prayer and meditation in the Bible. Go ahead and begin to wrap your mind around the idea of a fast and what that will look like in the context of your life. What time of day will you set aside to pray? How could your routine change to accommodate time for spiritual growth? Planning ahead will help to alleviate stress. After all-fasting is a privilege, not a chore!

As you decide on which type of fast is best for you, consider any physical limitations you might have. Go to the grocery store ahead of time and choose items that fit into your fast's parameters, so you aren't having to wander through later when you're hungry. Stay hydrating by drinking plenty of water and continue any medications you're on. Finally, try to remember that the spiritual benefit is greater than the physical sacrifice.

Our Miracle Offering is a display of radical generosity.
